

MERMAID'S NEW PRODUCTION CELEBRATES CONTEMPORARY CLASSICS

Mermaid Theatre of Nova Scotia will mark its forty-eighth season with the first staged adaptation of three favorite contemporary storybooks. Directed to very young audiences, the hour-long production entitled *It's Okay* to *Be Different – Stories by Todd Parr* will be launched in 2020-2021, following intensive workshops and prototype development.

Todd Parr is the author and ilustrator of more than 40 books for children, including the New York Times bestsellers The I Love You Book, The Earth Book, and The Thankful Book. His books are available in over forty countries throughout the world. He was the co-creator of the 3X EMMYnominated children's television show ToddWorld™, and he has created several short films for Sesame Street. His work is published by Little, Brown Books for Young Readers, Todd Parr a division of Hachette Book Group.

Mermaid's new work will be directed

and adapted by Jim Morrow, creator of numerous internationally-acclaimed Mermaid productions. The show will feature a diverse cast, an innovative approach to puppetry manipulation and costruction, combined with playful original music for which the company has earned worldwide praise. The world premiere performances are scheduled to take place in Singapore on August 1, 2020 under the auspices of Act 3 International, Mermaid's long-time presenting partner.

LOCAL AND COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

INSTITUTE OF PUPPETRY ARTS: A) PROFESSIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM:

ANIMOTION, a three-week intensive program for theatre professionals, community recreation leaders and educators. Dates for the twelfth annual event, augmented by a new segment, are April 20 – March 5, 2020 (Performance) and May 25 – 29, 2020 (Production). The sessions are designed for those with a strong interest in puppetry and physical theatre and the desire to expand their range of abilities in both creation and manipulation.

B) OUTREACH PROGRAM: (year-round) A series of specialized puppetry workshop programs, ranging from several hours to ten-week sessions, designed for students from primary school through university. In addition to programs offered at the Institute's headquarters, instructors regularly travel to other communities in the Maritime region, and have established a teaching circuit in China and Singapore.

C) THEATRE LOFT: Unique in Canada, the Theatre Loft offers professional artists mentoring in all aspects of puppetry arts.

THE NUTCRACKER: (ongoing 1991 to the present) An annual collaborative effort between Symphony Nova Scotia, Halifax Dance, and Mermaid Theatre of Nova Scotia. Twenty-ninth season.

MERMAID IMPERIAL PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE:

A wide variety of live music and theatre events (including regular Mermaid performances) is annually hosted and presented in the Center's elegant 400- seat theatre. Attracting diverse audiences from surrounding counties as well as the metro region, the Centre has earned the support of local sponsors and has become recognized as a vital community initiative.

LEADERS AT HOME - AMBASSADORS ABROAD

Mermaid Theatre of Nova Scotia's unique adaptations of children's literature have delighted more than 6 million young people in 19 countries on 4 continents. The company performs annually for more than 200,000 spectators, and ranks among North America's most active touring organizations. Closer to home, Mermaid maintains a strong local and regional presence through teaching, mentoring and presenting activities.

MERMAID'S UNIQUE OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

THE INSTITUTE OF PUPPETRY ARTS

With an inviting new storefront studio, a considerably expanded program of instruction and the appointment of Struan Robertson as its Education and Outreach Director, Mermaid's Institute of Puppetry Arts has quickly earned recognition as a major Canadian initiative.

For many years, Mermaid's Institute instructors have been warmly welcomed in worldwide locations, with workshops frequently offered in conjunction with the company's global touring. Closer to home, the Institute's broad array of programs directed to puppetry fans of all ages and levels of proficiency is unique in Canada. Mermaid's home community has eagerly embraced sessions for Grown-Ups (featuring libation and music), classes for youngsters in both school and studio settings, and pre-and post-performance workshops following family audience programming at the Mermaid Imperial Performing Arts Centre. The newly-launched YouTheatre initiative enables local adolescents to share their own stories, as well as provides access to arts programing not generally available in rural Nova Scotia. At the other end of the spectrum, the Institute's annual three-week intensive program for theatre professionals regularly attracts national and international participants, and has added a component providing an introduction to design and construction. In the seasons ahead, the Institute hopes to offer instruction to Seniors.

Mermaid offers cost-free residency opportunities to individual theatre artists, organizations, and companies with a desire to use objects as a medium for telling stories. By sharing its facilities, creative and administrative skills and other resources, Mermaid continues to invest in the development of emerging theatre artists and companies at home in Atlantic Canada, across the country, and beyond.


